WARRINGTON DOLPHINS LONG DISTANCE SWIMMING CLUB ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1976

It is with planeaux that I present the Warrington Dolphins Long Distance Swimming Club Annual Report for 1976.

Last season saw the club achieve its record total mileage and we are once again close to this figure having totalled 808% miles for 1976. This year however, is outstanding in the number of championship wins and record times taken by club members.

Claire Allman a junior in her first full season equalled the regard in the Club's own Pickmere Junior Ladies Championship and took 1st place in the River Wharfe, Derwentwater, Waterloo and Bala Junior Championships and also broke the existing records for both Derwentwater and Waterloo Lake. Elaine Jordan became the first junior to swim a two way Solent and also took the River Esk breast stroke record.

Chris Carter had a great season in that despite sacrificing the opportunity to enter certain swims whilst crewing for other swimmers, he still totalled 79 miles for the season, won Loch Lomond championship breaking the record in the process and established a new record for the two way Coniston.

Bill Dutton won the Morecambe Bay Championship for the 3rd successive year and may well be on his way to a Windermere championship hat trick having won this 10½ mile event for the second successive year.

Kevin Murphy set off twice this season to satisfy his most immediate ambition to become the first person to swim a three way channel. Unfortunately due to adverse conditions Kevin was forced to retire after $1\frac{2}{3}$ and 1 crossings respectively. Kevin twice broke the than existing record for the 17 mile Wash (Skegness to Nunstanton) and also took the record for the 23 mile Loch Mess swim.

Dilys Beynon won the two-way $20\frac{1}{2}$ mile Windermere Championship and was also second in the Mumbles - Aberavon swim.

Margaret Smith completed $19\frac{1}{2}$ miles in Loch Lomond before retiring and made a brave but unsuccessful attempt on the North Channel. Margaret took the allcomers breast stroke record for the number Spurn Point to Cleethorpes swim, first place, and ladies breast stroke record in Lough Neagh.

Gina Clarke in her first full season as a senior deserves special mention, having taken second place in 3 championships.

Paul Tew who took 4th place in 2 way Windermere had his swimming season suddenly curtailed when, in setting out for a 6 way Windermere attempt, cut his foot on a broken bottle whilst wading into the water, necessitating hospital treatment and stimches.

Kevin Ferguson had some fine swims and became our latest Windermere swimmer in

completing the championship. Kevin is now regularly beating his "dad".

Ken Bailey despite his Channel disappointment assures me that he intends to crack the Channel next season.

The grandfather of the club, Arthur Williams, became the oldest person to complete a 2 way Coniston and completed the 10 mile Morecambe Bay swim in the same championship as his grand daughter Gina Clarke. Our "flyer" John Heapy chalked up another first by completing Kerrera to Oban for the first time ever on butterfly and totalled 21 miles for

Bob Keating was unfortunate in sustaining a medical incapacity which restricted his outdoor swimming but as with Paul Kochanek, gave an invaluable service in crewing boats.

I feel that special thanks are due to both Alan Humphries who resigned from the post of Club Secretary and Cec Shallcross who resigned as Club Coach and Treasurer, for the many years of service they have given to the Club in these capacities. I should point out that both are still active in club affairs and will, I hope, continue to be so in the future.
