ANNUAL REPORT 1981

WELCOME to yet another Annual Report where the following words will show that the Dolphins have once again had a terrific season. The mileage chart reads 884 miles and although this is a little below last year I put this down to the exceptionally cold start to the season which forced a few of our swimmers to retire from the earlier swims.

This season brought an exceptional number of championship places to the Dolphins with 25 first places, 23 second places and 9 third places. A number of these went to two of our junior swimmers namely Helen Driver and Ian Ainsworth who were both placed in every championship they completed.

Four of our members had disappointment awaiting them at Dover Vince was unable to swim due to injury, Sue Johnson Couldn't get the right weather, Helen Driver swam for approximately 10 hours and was forced to retire a few miles from France and Dave Palmer swam for 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours and had to retire 4 miles north west of the Cape. Dave sent me some very interesting reading in the form of his Official Observers Report - Log of Channel Swim which I'm sure Dave won't mind me using a small but amusing quote.

2.54pm Stopped for a drink of Lemon and Lime (hot) and couldn't wait till France for his cigarette so he's having one now. What a ridiculous sight - sitting in the middle of the Channel desperately trying to keep a cigarette dry! We're 12 miles off Dover Harbour weather still very calm. I'm sure our members will not give up and will be back again next year.

There has been a fantastic tussle at the top of the mileage chart this year with Chris Green, 127, and Maurice Ferguson, 112 battling it out swim after swim although not necessarily the same swims. As you will see from the individual swims Chris has been spending a lot of his time, and no doubt money, at Morecambe Bay and although he hasn't got the record yet I feel sure he's not going to give up.

Steve Dockery who had to spend the beginning of the season reaching top fitness due to knee trouble got it altogether this year and clocked up eight first places and a few minor places as well as representing Britain and the Dolphins abroad.

Another member who has finally overcome the longer swims is Paul Kochanek who completed Coniston and the ASA 5 although he was out of time in the latter to notch up a total of 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Our President Ken Bailey while trying to support the Royal Wedding by decorating his house ended his swimming season for this year by falling from the ladder/garage roof? and doing considerable damage to his shoulder. We hope to see you back soon Ken.

A couple of members have decided to give swimming a bit of a rest and take up long distance running commonly called Marathon running. This could account for the lack of miles swum by both Chris Carter and Alan Humphries.

Paul Tew Still found time for a few miles inbetween getting married and house renovation. We hope it will be finished for next year then you can get back to your swimming you'll probably find it easier.

Quite a few members had a disappointing season which I think was due to the cold start to the season. Hopefully the weather will be kinder to us next year.

The Anderson Trophy which is presented for outstanding achievement or service to the Warrington Dolphins Long Distance Swimming Club was presented to Maurice Ferguson for his service as Championship Secretary over the previous seven years at last years Annual Dinner.

Lilian Bell who again completed Windermere this year raised a total of £250 for Spina Bifida at the same time. Lilian had a lot of support at the swim as a coachlead of cubs came to cheer her on.

The Super dolphin held again this year was won by Fred James but the weather this year turned out to be terrible and some outdoor events had to be cancelled and indoor events added. The committee have decided to purchase a trophy to be awarded annually, to the Super Dolphin to start in 1982.

Two marriages have taken place within the club this year and our congratulations go to Paul and Fiona Tew and Jeff and Pat Paley, with best wishes for your future happiness.

Finally may I extend our sincere thanks to the Pickmere Boating Company, the staff and management of Warrington Baths Department and all who have helped the club in any capacity over the past year.

PICKMERE CHAMPIONSHIPS 1981

I am pleased to report that the 1981 Pickmere Championships, were yet again a great success. As in keeping with other championships held this year, we fell victim of the weather, which turned out to be the worst weather for a Pickmere swim that I have ever known. Nevertheless the Senior Records were broken. The Junior Championship was well patronised, having 41 entrants of which 8 were forced to retire. It naturally goes without saying, that all swimmers, those who managed to stay the course and those who had to retire, deserve the warmest congratulations for their efforts. The conditions were not all that they could have been. The water was cold and there was quite a stiff breeze blowing across the lake adding to our difficulties. The rescue launch was kept busy, so busy in fact that at times, a swimmer that had been picked up on one side of the lake had to stay with the launch whilst it crossed the lake to another unfortunate swimmer and then dock with both swimmers. However all went well and there were no serious incidents. The Junior Ladies Championship was won by Helen Driver, with Karen Renshaw and Tracy Holcroft 2nd and 3rd respectively. The first breaststroke being Kay Daniels. The Junior Mens Championship was won by Karl Streeter with Ian Ainsworth and Ian Lawson 2nd and 3rd respectively, with Paul Gwatkin first Breaststroke. I must thank all who responded to our request for boat crews for the Junior swim, your support was excellent and very much appreciated.

By the time the Senior Championships were due to commence, the weather had taken a turn for the worse, and had really deteriorated. The stiff breeze of the morning, had become almost gale force, and it was with some difficulty that we were able to launch the boats. This coupled with the slow response on the part of some swimmers to take notice of the referees request to line up properly for the start, caused it to be somewhat delayed. Our request for boat crews for the senior swim wasn't responded to with as much enthusiasm and consequently the lake was only just covered enough for the swim to proceed. The Pickmere safety support record is second to none. We have more boats made available to us than many other championships but without crews these boats are useless to swimmers. May we hope for a better response for the 1982 Championships? However my thanks to those who did brave the elements and gave of these services, your efforts in such conditions were much appreciated. The Senior Ladies Championship was won in a new record time by Karen Toole with Juliet Smith 2nd and third place being shared by Sarah and Carole Hunt, first Breaststroke was Caroline Simister and first veteran was Marguerite Pike. The Senior Mens Championships was won by Steve Dockery in a new record time with Robert Sherburn and David Morgan 2nd and 3rd respectively, first breaststroke was Thomas Kellegher and first veteran was Dave Mace. Of the 98 entrants for the Senior swim, 8 did not swim and 10 had to retire. Here again it goes without saying, that all swimmers who started, those who managed to stay the course and those who were forced to retire, deserve the warmest congratulations for their efforts.

My 'thank yous' are many, for without the many people who gave of their time so willingly in the lead up to the championships and on the day of the championships, there would be no swim at all. To all those who helped prepare the lake on the day prior to the swim, to Karl Walker and Ken Robinson for their back up with their boats in assisting in the rescue work in the Senior Championship. To our two commentators Chris Carter for the Junior swim and John O'Hara for the Senior swim, keeping us informed as to the progress of the swimmers, in what were foul conditions. To Dave Yeomans and Russ Holbrook, our two timekeepers. The time they spent out on the jetty in such weather must have seemed endless. They seemed to spend most of the day preventing time sheets, tables, chairs and themselves, in that order from being blown into the lake. Dave and Russ stepped into the breach left by our hitherto regular time keepers and did a magnificent job. Dare I say that they have carved a little niche for themselves in future championships?

To Mr and Mrs Peter Crowe, the President of the BLDSA and his wife for their attendance at our swim and to Mr Crowe in particular for acting as championship Referee. To the Red Cross for the efficient way they carried out their duties. Their presence is always an assurance. To the Pickmere Boating Company, for all the facilities and to the management and staff of the Lakeside Restaurant. It's a wonder the hens were able to cope with the demand for egg and chips. My thanks must also go to the Executive Committee of the Warrington Dolphins, for their help and guidance. I know that they will not mind if I single out one of their number for a special mention, my thanks to Wendy James, Secretary of the Dolphins for all her help in the preparation of programmes, certificates and countless other tasks, that go to making the championship the success it is.

Once again very many thanks to all who attended especially the swimmers for without you we could all go home. I look forward, as I hope you do to the next Pickmere Championship which will be held on SATURDAY 5th JUNE 1982.
