ANNUAL REPORT 1984

Well the nights are getting darker and we're deciding whether or not to turn on the heating, lets look back on what was one of the hottest summers on record. Unfortunately this does not show in the mileage chart which is slightly down on previous years. Individuals were dogged by illness, bad weather (?) and lack of crews when they were feeling on top form. Despite all this our members still managed $589\frac{3}{4}$ miles, with 8 first places, 6 second places and three third places as well as new record, veterans champions, butterfly records and many age group winners.

In first place on the mileage chart you will find Chris Green who is after a retirement home at Morecambe. With 124 miles he completed a two way Morecambe, a Fleetwood to Morecambe and 4 other separate Morecambe Bays. One of these earned him the Morecambe to Grange Record of 2.29.00.

Many of the above mentioned placings went once again to Steve Dockery, With $61\frac{1}{4}$ miles he gained 7 firsts, two seconds, two thirds, 4 new records and a new British Gents Record on Windermere.

Lillian Brooks Bell on the other hand was not stopped by anybody or any thing and completed every swim she entered. Once again she completed a Windermere swim to retain her title of the oldest lady to swim Windermere in a very good time of 8.49.07. Having a fight for third place on the mileage chart were Lillian, Peter Axson and Ian Ainsworth. Peter in his first complete season totalled $51\frac{1}{4}$ miles while Ian in his first season as a Senior swimmer started to complete the longer distances with Torbay and Windermere under his belt though he still prefers to swim the two miler at Grimsby.

John Heapy had planned more swims than he completed this season but illness when he had crews and fit with no crew were his problems. Still he completed three swims on Butterfly (I think he's forgotten how to do crawl) and got two Butterfly Records so the season wasn't all bad.

Congratulations must go to Dilys and Payl who it was reported are completing swims between feeds? more of this later. Dilys swam a total of $42\frac{1}{2}$ miles and Paul 24. Paul had a hard swim on Loch Tummel and unfortunately was forced to retire but no doubt he will try again another season. Chris Carter has also been swimming between feeds but has now added cycling to his list of abilities. Chris took part in the Lomdon - Paris Triathlon which was a Relay where they had to run from London-Dover, swim across the Channel then cycle to Paris.

Our President, Maurice Ferguson was another who was struck by illness, Hayfever, which he says he caught from his son in law. Never mind Maurice you'll have to watch out next season as Fred has nearly finished my new kitchen and will no doubt be back in the swim next year.

Steve usually breaks records by seconds but Peter Axson must have been pleased when he finished Windermere this year to find he'd knocked 75 minutes off his previous time. Peter also won four of the age group events events this year.

Last, Last and nearly last is how Harry Brooks sends in his list of swims, he's obviously very proud of his new position but he still completed $35\frac{3}{4}$ miles which will have taken him nearly as long as Christook to swim his hundred miles.

Our juniors keep travelling the country and spreading the Dolphin name. It will be heard much further next year when Phillip Stringer realises what he's got involved in (I believe Dads Joining too). Simon would have swam more but his dads illness got in his way.

Sue Johnson announced her engagement this year to Jeffrey Corkhill. Congratulations to you both, perhaps we'll see Jeffrey swimming too (if you cannot beat them join them).

Two new Dolphins also entered the world this year. Our congratulations to Dilys and Paul on a daughter Helen (I believe). Also to Chris and Dorothy Carter with a daughter Jennifer Kate back in March and a sister for Andrew.

At our Annual Dinner in 1983 the Anderson Trophy was awarded to Mrs Sunny Anderson. I'M sure I've no need to list Mrs Anderson's help and assistance she has given to the club but last year was the 50th Anniversary of her Channel crossing and I'm sure this presentation was a climax to her anniversary year.

Last but not least may I offer our thanks to the Pickmere Boating Company, and the staff of Warrington Baths for all their help and assistance over the last twelve months.

If all goes well for me at the AGM this should be the last Annual Report I write so if their are any offers for the position of secretary the jobs all yours. Many thanks and good luck with your swims in 1985.

We staged our 20th Annual Championship this year on Saturday 9th June.

distance swimming. I am pleased to say that for first timers they put up
a good show completing the course and notching up what is hopefully the

first openmuater swim. They all did well, however their gain is our loss, for

'carrier pidgeons' and the 'damp sticks and blanket' which were replaced by
the pidgeons, for anyone else with communication difficulties. One item of
pleasure derived from the radios came on the day before the swim. We were
setting up the course, myself, Maurice Ferguson and Dave Yeomans were trying
out the radio links, 'good buddying it 'etc., all over the lake. Suddenly
our wavelenghts were crossed with a couple of truckers on the nearby
motorway, sounding off on the vision that had just passed them, "a blond in
the red sports with her top down". Well what can you do in the middle of the
lake in a situation like that. Back to the swim !!!
Once again we were doubly favoured both with the number of competitors.
127 in all, and the weather, it was so hot at times that the spectators
were hard put not to join the swimmers in the water. As usual it was the
