Throughout the year the club has had numerous successes in the events held around the country but it would be somewhat tedious to list them all, but the main outstanding achievement is the completion of 3 first time Windermere swims by Sally Baldwin, Caroline Smith and Mike Cooke, both Mike and Sally competing in their first year of competitive outdoor swimming. To top that all the above three are in training for their next jolly to France in 1994 - but on an individual basis, the club wishes them every success and another three Channel swimmers in the club can't be bad.

The year started for the club with its own well known Pickmere Lake Championship, which I am pleased to inform you is to be held on the 4th June 1994, entry forms should be available from the BLDSA Annual Dinner in the coming year. This years event also took a small diversion as we held the Northern Counties Outdoor Championship alongside our own event, this was done to try to encourage more swimmers from the indoor scene to participate in long distance swims and to ease them outdoors - it might catch on you know!
