I am pleased to report on another successful season for Warrington Dolphins. Our members have swum a total of 375 miles this season and have been represented in 26 events, including one channel swim and a record setting relay swim on Loch Ness.

Congratulations to Paul Tew on his Channel swim this summer. Paul swam the Channel for the first time in 1976 whilst a member of the Dolphins and rejoined the Dolphins a couple of years ago. This summer completed his second channel swim in a time that was 10 minutes faster than his first swim!

In September the Direct Loch Ness Relay team (all members of the Dolphins) completed the first ever two-way Loch Ness relay swim. Dave Quatermaine, Tom Nolan, Liz Horn, Tony Whelan Jnr, Helen Driver and Caroline Smith completed the 46 mile swim in 26 hours, 13 minutes and 10 seconds and Steve Critchley was our observer. We hit choppy water a few times, particularly on the last eight miles of the swim but most of the time we were very lucky. In August Dave Quatermaine made his third attempt at the Channel, but unfortunately was not successful. He was taken out of the water after ten hours with hypothermia.

Lots of people came along and had a fun evening with an excellent band, 'Foxes Bark', and a hot pot or an extremely hot veggie chilli - believe me, I had tears in my eyes from it!
